- To guarantee the long-term viability of wildlife populations within Latin American zoos and aquariums.


STRUCTURE OF ALPZA

ALPZA?




Being a member of ALPZA provides recognition and positioning in one of the most biodiverse regions of the world: Latin America.

ALPZA represents its members in international forums, and acts as the liaison with the international zoological community.




CONSERVATION OPPORTUNITIES

Ability to take part in projects coordinated by the Association.





ALPZA organizes an annual high-quality conference, in which its members can benefit from special rates. This meeting brings together the entire community of the Association, to share their experiences and address the most important challenges for the community of zoos and aquariums in Latin America and the world, as well as to enrich the knowledge of its professionals with expert world-class speakers.

Participation in webinars and exclusive talks for members of the Association.

Monthly ALPZA committees hold specialized talks and webinars on various topics to share their knowledge and experiences with the community.

ALPZA also coordinates scholarships to support the participation of its members in international events (conferences, courses, workshops, etc.), stimulating the participation of all levels of zoo staff, from directors to animal keepers.



ACCESS TO WEB RESOURCES

ALPZA's website attracts around 5,000 people each month. The site has two sections; one open to the public where the work of the Association and its members is shared to the general public, and a members-only section with the following benefits:

Access to scientific and technical information developed by the Association.

Possibility of sharing documents related to the management and care of wild animals with other members of the community. ALPZA translates documents from English into Spanish and Portuguese in order to extend their reach to other languages.



Access to the ALPZA Annual Report. Which incorporates the work carried out by the Executive Office, the committees, accredited institutions, certified conservation projects, and the financial report of the association.

Access to the document "Footprints that Impact". Which describes contributions made by our members in conservation, education, animal welfare, sustainability, and care of its wildlife populations.


Share news in the ALPZA newsletter. Our Association has a tri-monthly newsletter in English and Spanish, to disseminate the most important news, good practices, and milestones that involve ALPZA members.

MEMBERSHIP DOCUMENT

All applicants must read this document that provides essential information about ALPZA and its membership.

APPLICATION FORM

The institutions who wants to access the ALPZA membership must answer the application form, attaching all the requested documents.


Once the executive office receives all the information, it will be confirmed via email.

START OF THE INTERNAL PROCESS

To begin the process, the registration fee must be paid to ALPZA.

Once ALPZA confirms the correct reception of the payment, the internal process of reviewing the membership application will begin. In a maximum of 15 days the active members will make their evaluation.

APPLICATION PROCESS



MEMBERSHIP ALPZA

Once the internal review process is complete, ALPZA's executive management contacts the applicant institution to inform it of the result and the associated costs.

MEMBERSHIP PAYMENT

As soon as ALPZA receives the registration and membership payment, the executive office will inform it officially by email and will request the official logo of the institution along with the main contacts to include in the database.

OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

In a maximum period of two weeks after receiving the logo and the main contacts, ALPZA will announce the new institutional membership internally and externally, with posts on social networks and including it on the website.





Registration fee

The registration fee is USD 500 to be paid when the executive office confirms receipt of the application form.

Annual membership

The annual cost of ALPZA membership for institutional members is USD 1,000 per year.
